

5 Real-World Discovery Missions

Learning doesn't have to stay on a screen. Complete these simple missions together and discover how much learning is hiding in everyday life.

Mission 1 — Traffic Signal Detective

Observe a traffic signal from a safe location with an adult. What colors do you see? What does each color mean? How do people respond to the signals?

Mission 2 — Grocery Store Explorer

Find three foods that come from plants, three items sold by weight or quantity, and one package with an interesting symbol or label. Talk about what you discovered.

Mission 3 — Nature Observer

Find a safe outdoor spot. Look closely at one leaf, stone, flower, insect, or tree. Draw it or describe its shape, texture, color, and surroundings.

Mission 4 — Kitchen Scientist

With an adult, choose a simple kitchen observation: melting, mixing, dissolving, floating, sinking, or changing temperature. Make a prediction, observe, and discuss what happened.

Mission 5 — Travel Learning Challenge

During a safe family trip, look for signs, maps, landmarks, numbers, languages, shapes, or patterns. Choose one thing and ask: What does this tell us about this place?
